Executive Summary

- Overall, there were 6,900 full and partial (with sufficient answers) responses to the public Neighbourhood Policing Survey.
- Breakdowns across the LPAs are similar to actual population rates, however rates do vary at the electoral ward level
- 75% of respondents (5,095) were not aware of what visibility/contact opportunities Police have in their local area other than a general presence in the area/online. However, when asked, 76% said that they would consider attending some form of engagement session if they were aware.
- Rates are similar across LPAs, but respondents from Dudley and Sandwell were slightly less likely to want to attend events. Where respondents wouldn't attend, they were still keen to see digital updates from those sessions.
- More than a third of respondents (2,392) said that they didn't see regular updates from their local police online.
 - This was highest in Dudley, with 42% saying that they didn't see regular updates.
- There is a general lack of awareness amongst respondents around local priorities and how local policing teams were tackling anti-social behaviour.
 - 88% (5,629) said that they were not aware of the local community priorities and
 - 61% (4,193) said that they had not seen any information in the past 12 months about how ASB was being tackled.
- When asked what they would like neighbourhood teams to share, 82% (5,191) said they would like to see regular updates on how we're dealing with crime. Other things were:
 - 73% (4,670) said results (arrests/charges/court cases)
 - 56% (3,561) said local crime statistics
 - 53% (3,342) said awareness/crime prevention and safety tips

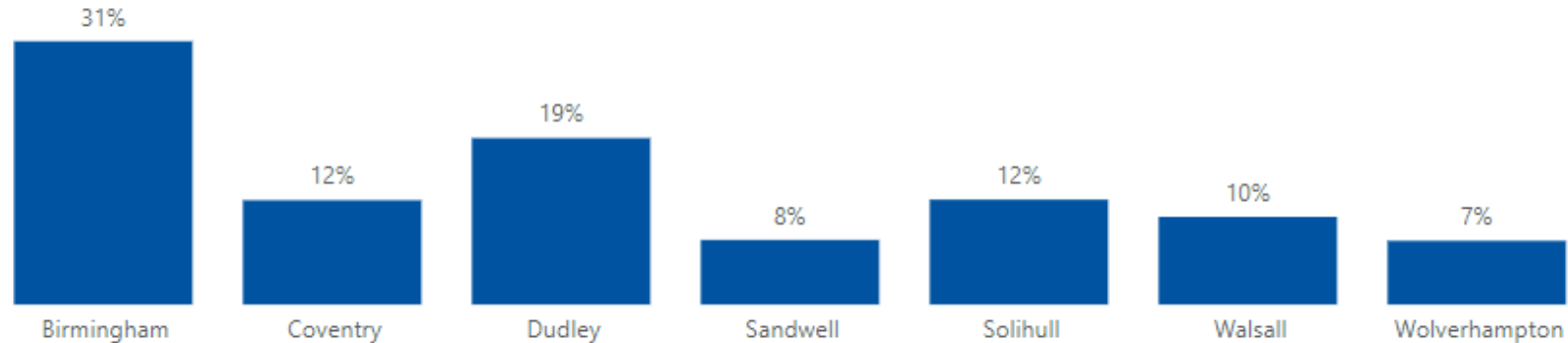

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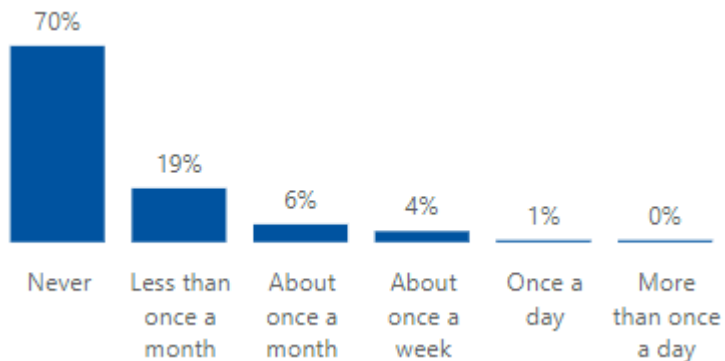

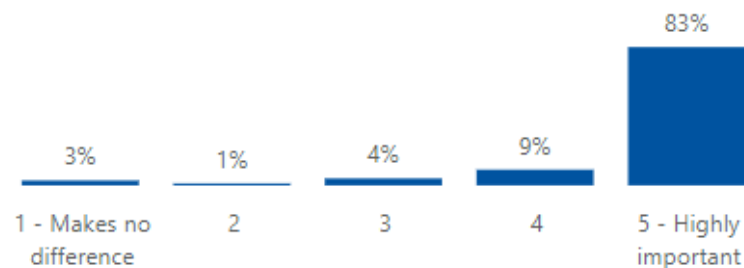
Which local policing area do you live in?

The breakdown of where respondents live was broadly similar to the population breakdown for the West Midlands, although some LPAs (Birmingham) saw a slightly lower response rate.

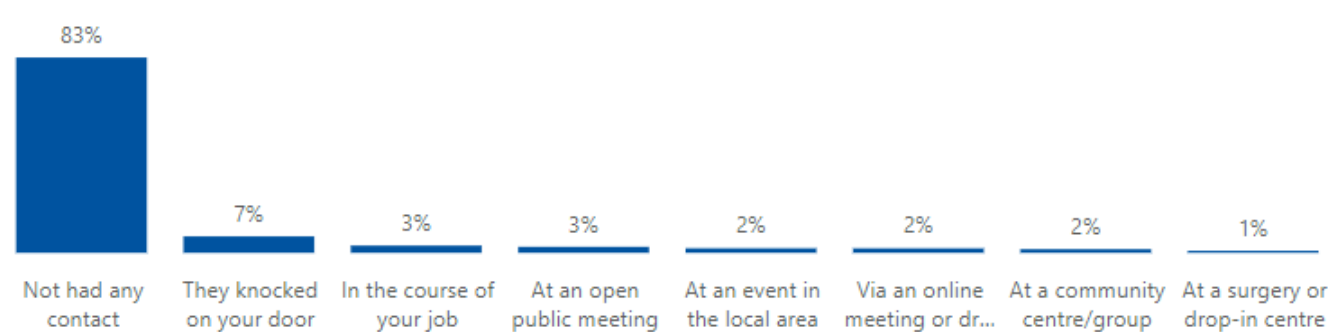
However, when drilling down to electoral wards there are some more significant differences - This should be taken into account when interpreting the findings later on.

70% of respondents indicated that on average they never see police officers or police community support officers (PCSOs) on foot patrol in their local area.

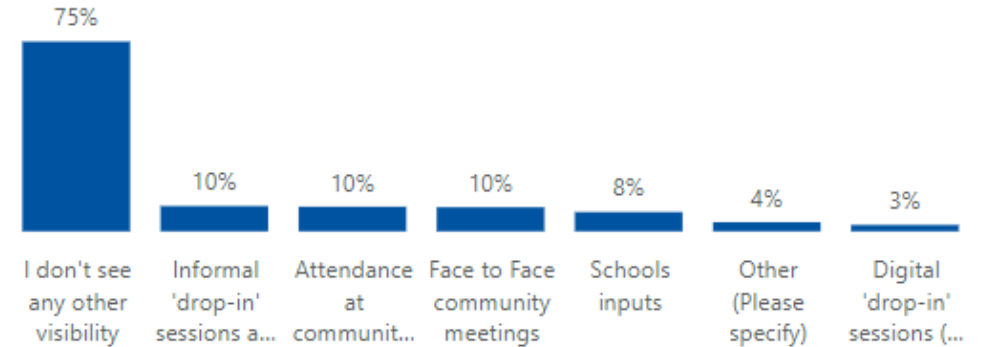

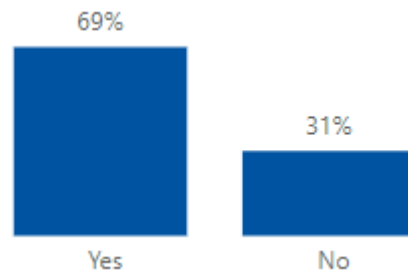

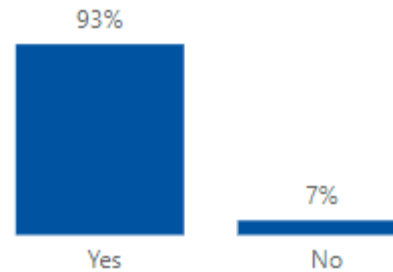

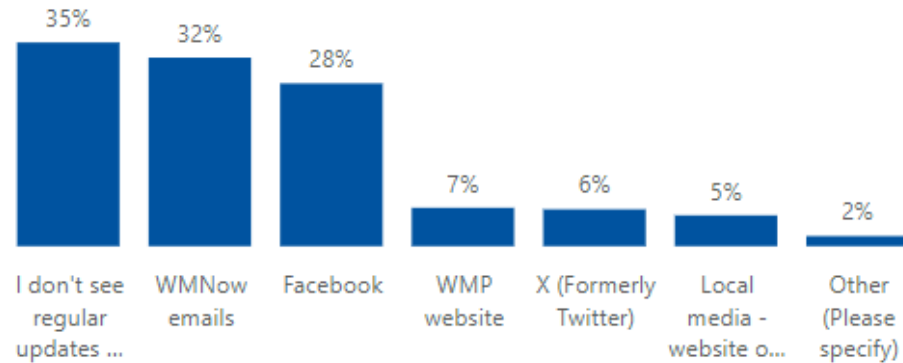

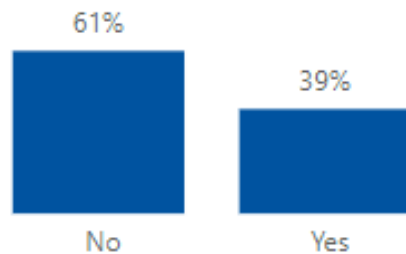

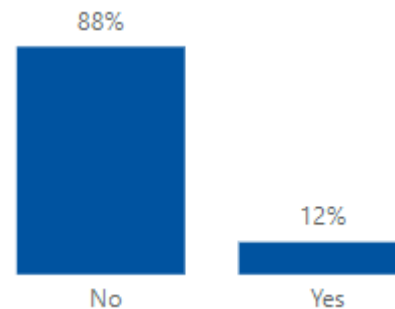

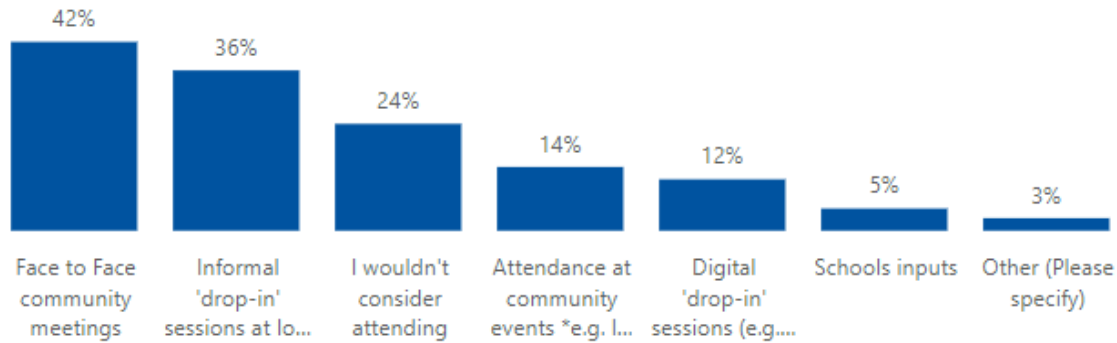

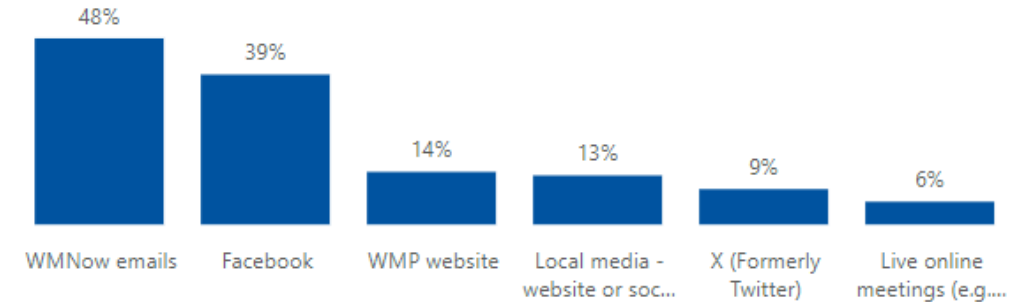

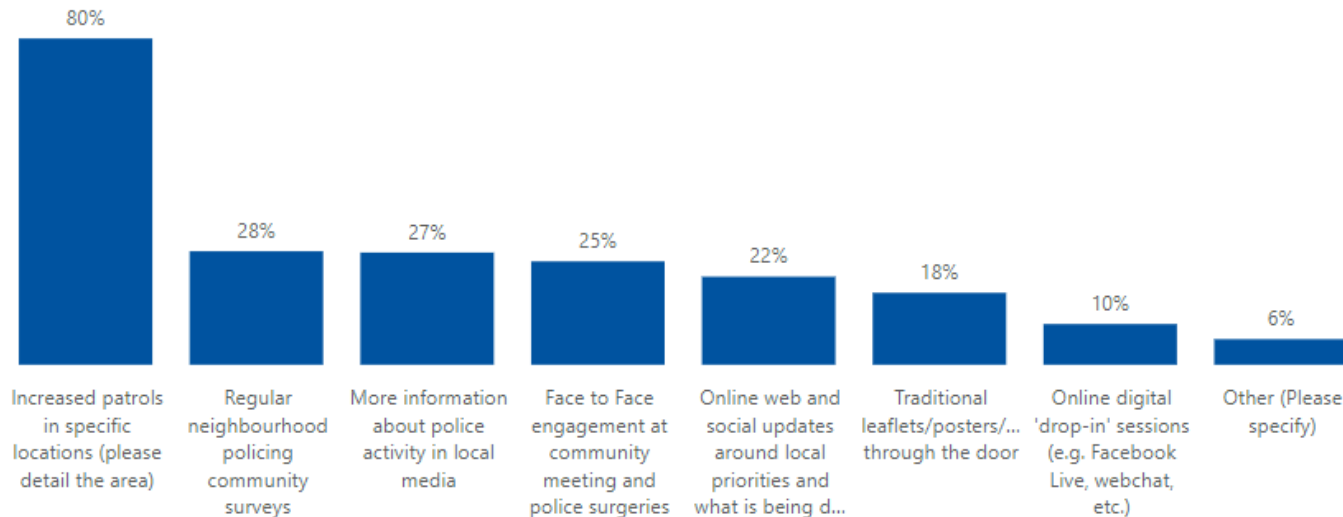

Even if respondents wouldn't consider attending in-person, they would still be interested in getting a digital update from the session. WMNow and Facebook were the most popular options for digital updates to be shared.

When asked what they would like local police to be doing, aside from increased patrols in specific locations, respondents said: 28% regular neighbourhood surveys; 27% more information about police activity in local media ; 25% face-to-face engagement at community meetings.

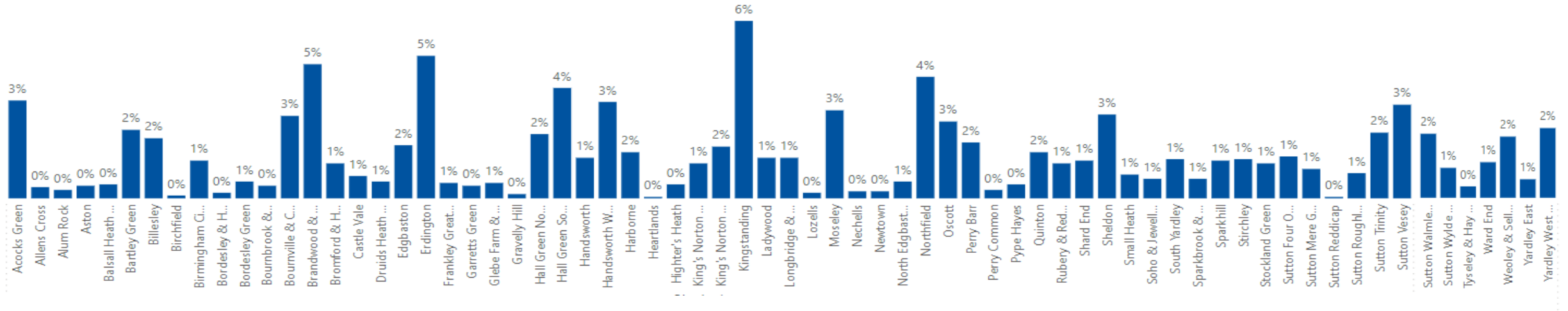

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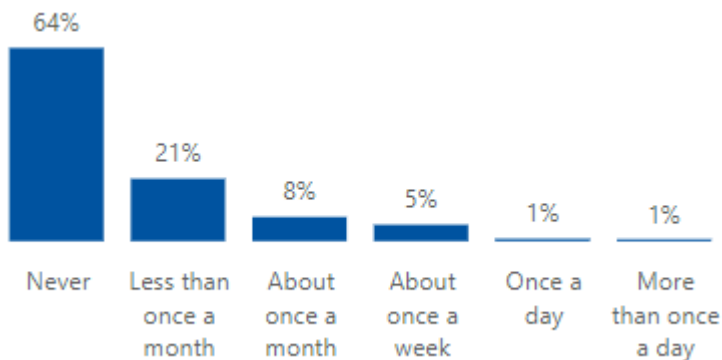

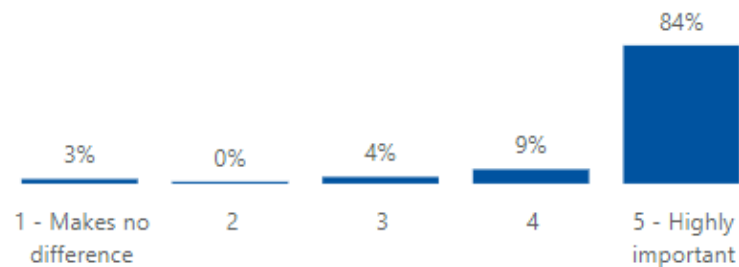
Which electoral ward do you live in?

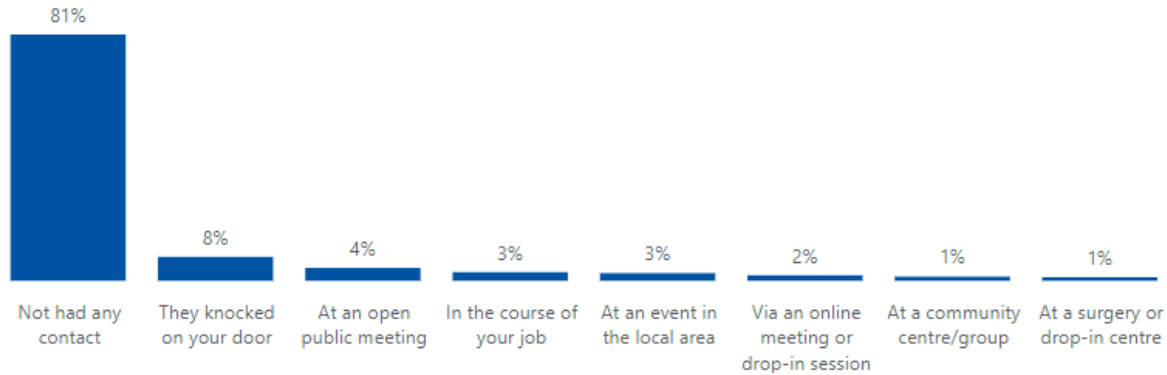

Areas less likely to see Officers/PCSOs on foot patrol were: Hall Green South, Handsworth Wood, and Kingstanding.

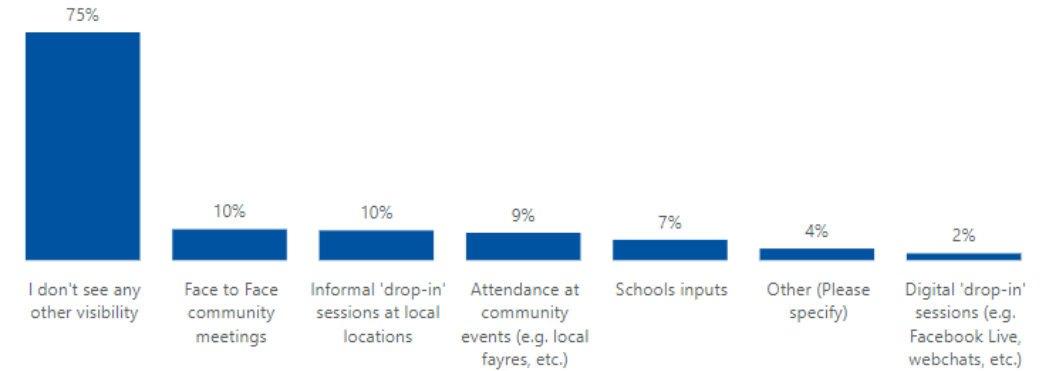

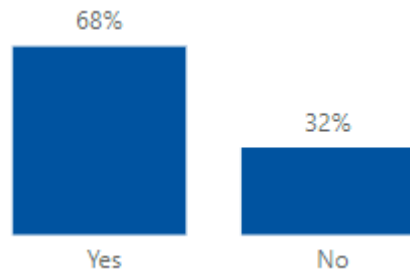

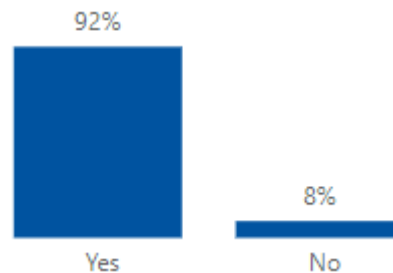

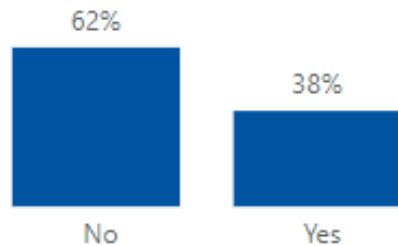

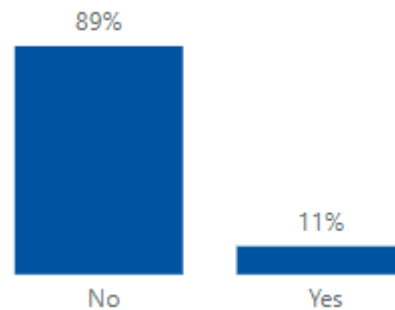

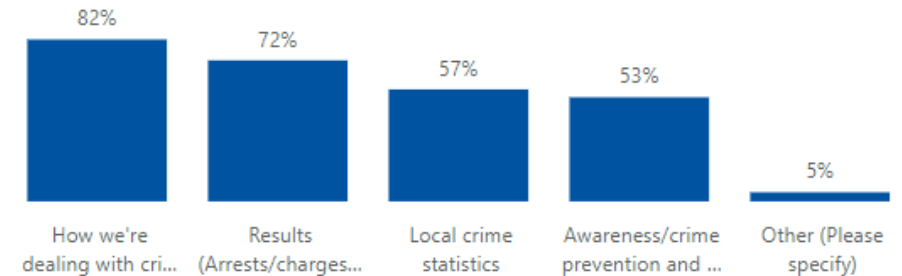

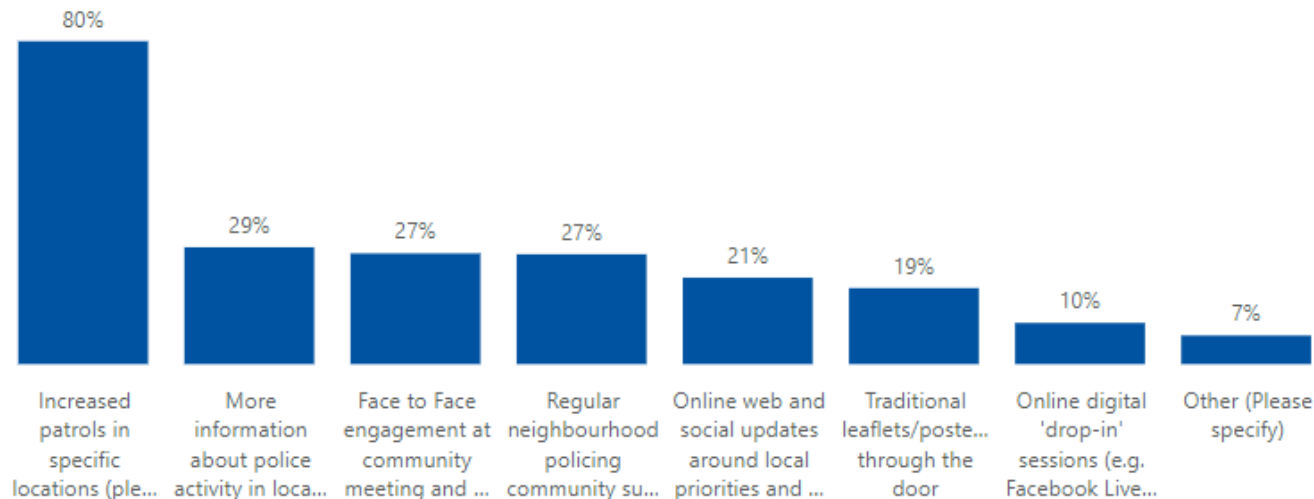

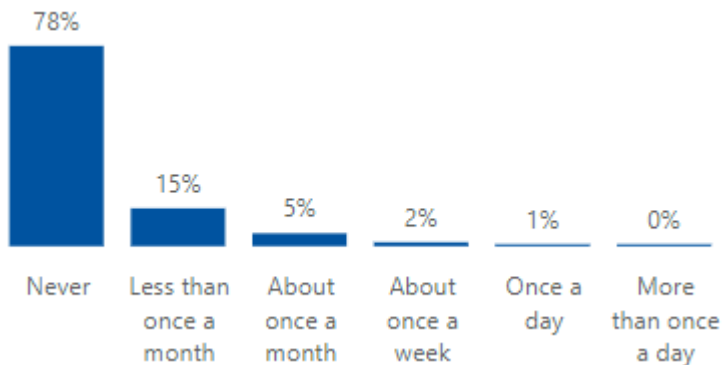

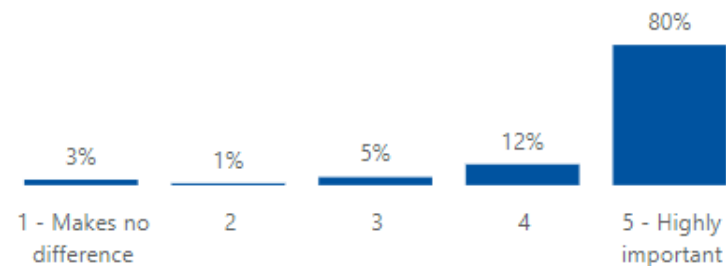
Which electoral ward do you live in?

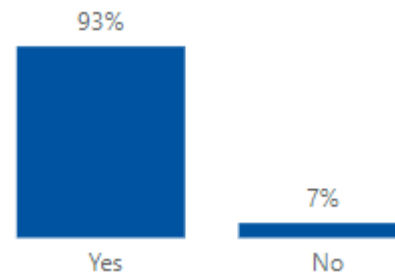

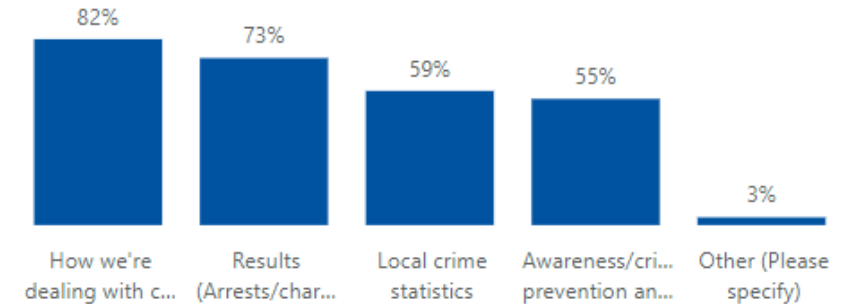

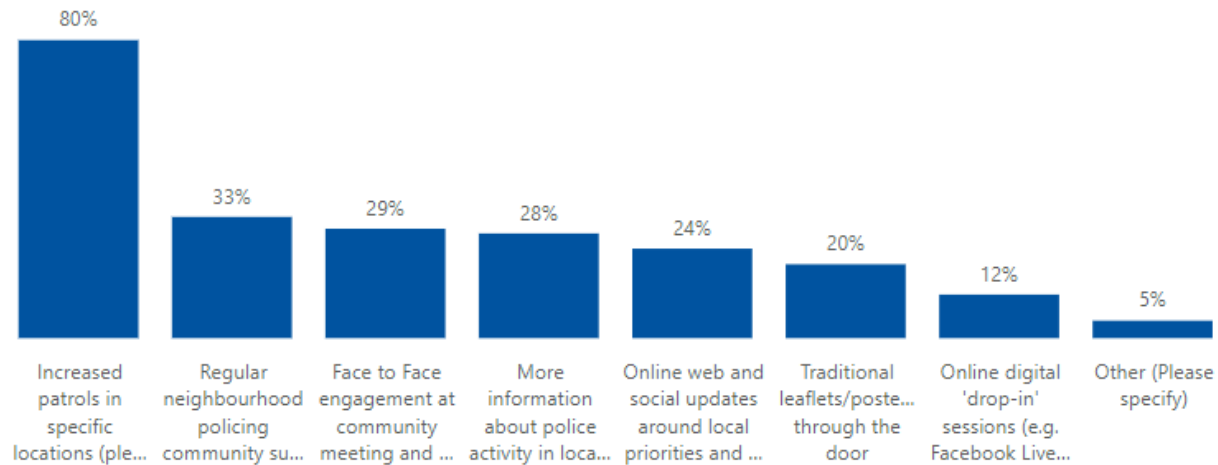

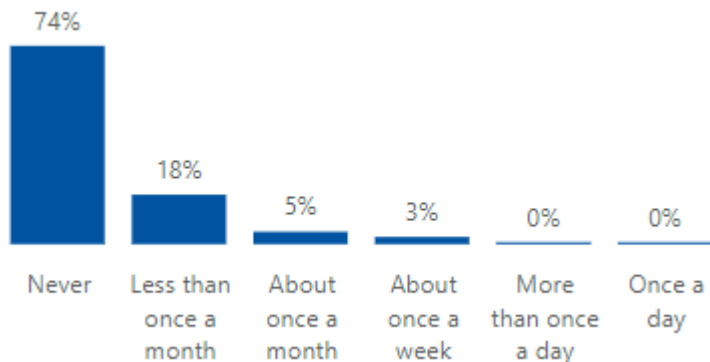

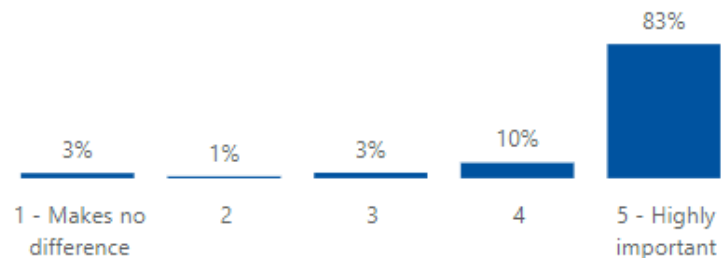
Which electoral ward do you live in?

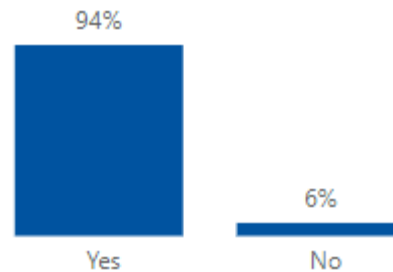

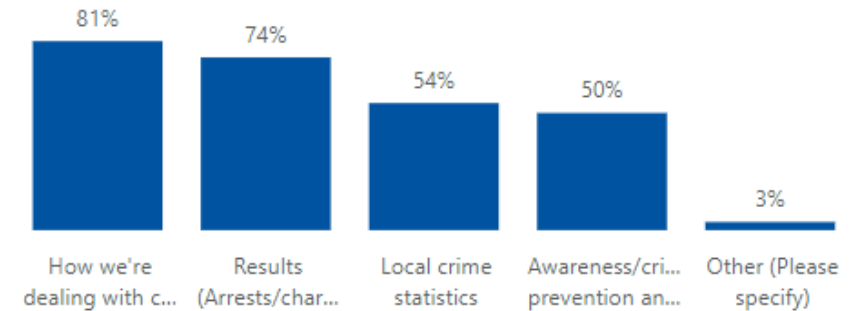

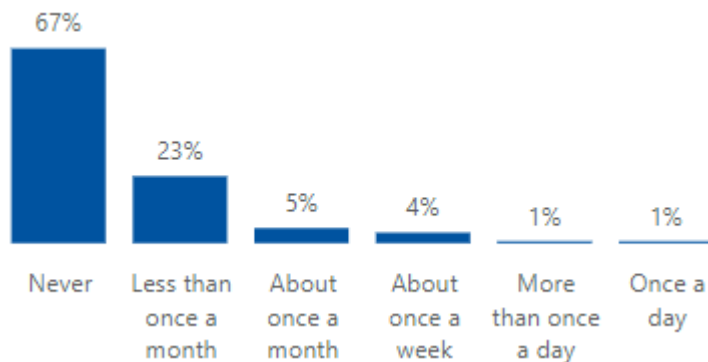

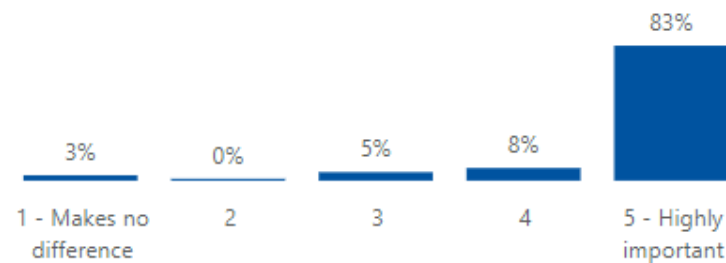
Which electoral ward do you live in?

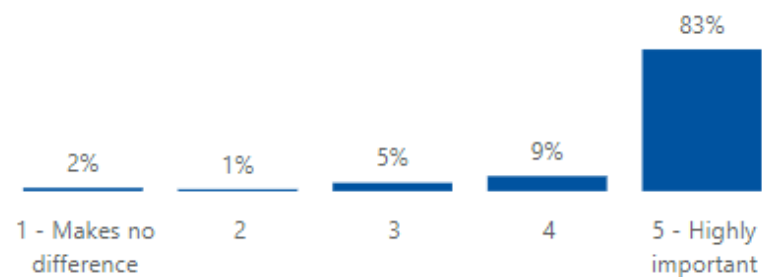
Which electoral ward do you live in?

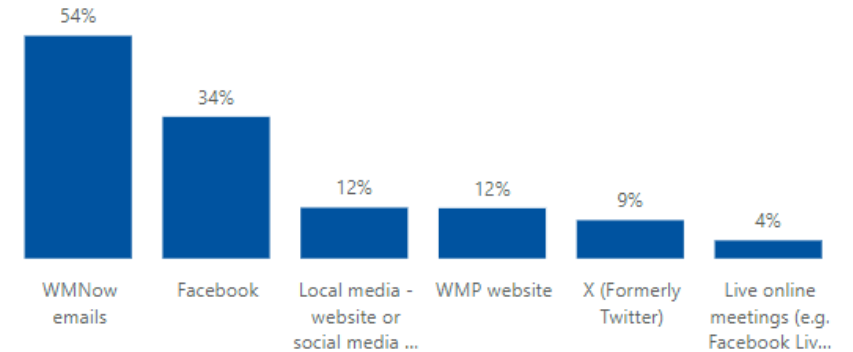

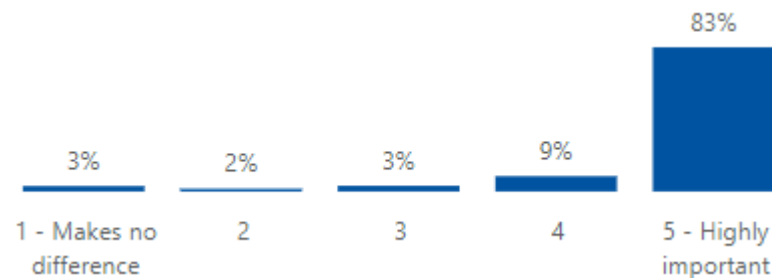
Which electoral ward do you live in?

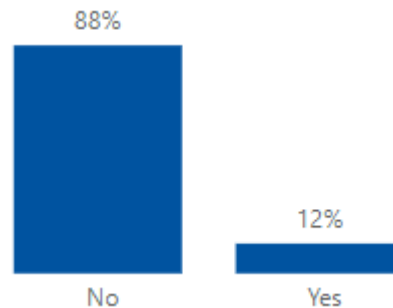

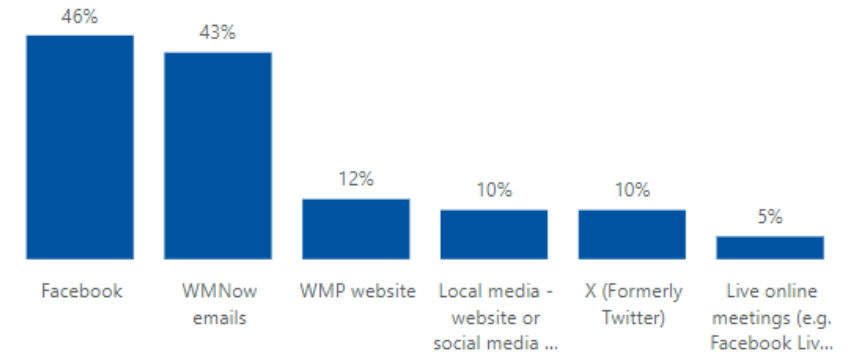

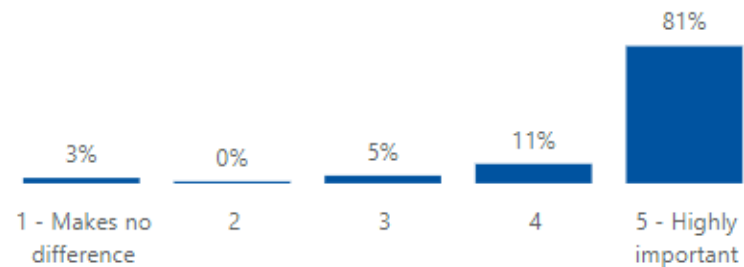
Which electoral ward do you live in?
